# Using Emergency Housing Vouchers to Address Homelessness

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
#### What are Emergency Housing Vouchers?

In response to Covid-19,
70,000 EHVs were deployed
to subsidize housing for
people experiencing or at
imminent risk of
homelessness.



Participants receive a **housing subsidy** that they can use in the **private rental market**, which covers rent and utility expenses beyond 30 percent of their adjusted monthly incomes.
